

Public Accessibility of Financial Interests

The Public Health Service, PHS, requires UC to make certain information regarding financial conflicts of interests available to the public under [42 CFR Part 50 Subpart F](#). If you have a question about the financial conflicts of interest of a UC investigator, you may request it using the process below.

Your request must meet the criteria established by the PHS and must include the investigator name(s) and topic of the research. The Institution will respond in writing within five business days if the request meets the following three criteria:

1. The significant financial interest was disclosed and is still held by the senior/key personnel
2. The Institution determines that the significant financial interest is related to the PHS-funded research; and
3. The Institution determines that the significant financial interest is a financial conflict of interest

Please note: If you submit a request which does not meet the above criteria, you will receive a written response indicating your request did not meet the NIH reporting requirements.

Please submit your request via email to ConflictOfInterest@uc.edu and include the name of the UC investigator and the study title or nature of the research.

If your request meets the above criteria, the information that the Institution makes available via written response shall include, at a minimum, the information required by the regulation [42 CFR Part 50 Subpart F](#). The institution will provide:

- i. Investigator's name;
- ii. Investigator's title and role with respect to the research project;
- iii. Name of the entity in which the Significant Financial Interest is held;
- iv. Nature of the Significant Financial Interest; and
- v. Approximate dollar value of the Significant Financial Interest (dollar ranges are permissible: \$0-\$4,999; \$5,000-\$9,999; \$10,000-\$19,999; amounts between \$20,000-\$100,000 by increments of \$20,000; amounts above \$100,000 by increments of \$50,000) or a statement that the interest is one whose value cannot be readily determined through reference to public prices or other reasonable measures of fair market value
